



TREATY OF MONTAUP

This official Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nation to Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nation Treaty of Peace and Friendship and Health and Wellness, officially titled and henceforth known as the "Treaty of Montaup", is now established between the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations of the lands contemporarily referred to as the Americas, and is signed and approved by the Principal Chief of each of the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations of the lands contemporarily referred to as the Americas.

This official Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nation to Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nation "Treaty of Montaup" is established in a truthful, respectful, dignified and honorable manner that promotes goodness, honesty, righteousness, equity and love in the spirit, traditions and ways that our Creator, our ancestors and our elders have always respected and continue to keep.

The "Treaty of Montaup" is established to cultivate, uphold and promote a true and lasting spirit of peace and friendship and health and wellness between the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations of the lands contemporarily referred to as the Americas to mutually share their ancestral traditions, cultures, languages and ceremonies in a manner that protects their integrity and respects the individual cultural norms and beliefs of each of the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations, as was intended by the Creator.

The "Treaty of Montaup" is further established to safeguard and promote the culture, livelihood, posterity and sovereignty of and for the communities, elders, families, children, loved ones and future generations of each of the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations.

The "Treaty of Montaup" is also established to promote, support and cultivate individual, tribal community, national and international health through the use of traditional tribal health practices, medicines and spiritual ceremony, while also utilizing culturally appropriate and tribally approved forms of modern western medicines and modern information technologies (IT) or digitized health systems.

The "Treaty of Montaup" does promote, support and uphold tribal health data sovereignty, private health data security and future physical and mental health for the elders, families, teenagers, men, women, children and disabled persons of each of the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations.

The "Treaty of Montaup" does acknowledge, respect, uphold and honor all health-related rights recognized in binding international instruments (both present and future), does acknowledge the right to attain the highest standard of physical, mental and spiritual health in a culturally appropriate manner, and does take into account the traditional practices and medicines as well as the individual customs and laws of each of the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations.

The "Treaty of Montaup" does acknowledge, respect, uphold and honor the spirit, intent and provisions of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP), the United Nations Expert Mechanism on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, the American Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People (ADRIP) of the Organization of American States, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the Charter and the Constitution of the Federation of Aboriginal Nations of the Americas, and the individual customs and laws of each of the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations and all other current and future lawfully and equitably appropriate documentation that shall be established subject to the "free, prior and informed consent" of and by each of the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations.

The "Treaty of Montaup" does also embrace current and future lawfully and equitably appropriate health documentation, digitized communication and tribal health data collection related programs, policies and initiatives that shall be established and is subject to the "free, prior and informed consent" of each of the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations.

All provisions of the "Treaty of Montaup" do acknowledge and uphold the respective rights and obligations of the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations under the Indigenous Treaty of Peace and Friendship and the Indigenous Treaty of Health and Wellness, signed by and with The Alii Nui/ The King and Leader of "Zone 11 - Peace Nation of Polynesia" or "The Polynesian Kingdom of Atooi" on the 27th day of the month of July in the year 2018 of the Gregorian calendar in Niagara, New York, the ancestral lands of the Seneca people.

The "Treaty of Montaup" will serve as the framework, foundation and barometer for the establishment of future treaties, agreements, collaborations and partnerships between the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations and will be conducted not only in a manner and spirit of perpetual truth, honesty and righteousness that seeks to and does serve the mutual interest and benefit of all the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations, but also to ensure integrity and transparency through the utilization of appropriate current and future technologies and technological advances, so that our Creator, our good spirits and our dearly departed ancestors will honor and respect this agreement and covenant.

May The Creator bless and approve of the "Treaty of Montaup" and may each of the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations share, uphold and protect this "Treaty of Montaup" with and for one another in an equitable, righteous, respectful and honorable manner and spirit for as long as the sun does rise and the rivers and the oceans do exist.

For the benefit and in the interest of all of the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations is the "Treaty of Montaup" signed this 22nd day, of the Sixth month, of the year Two Thousand and Nineteen of the Gregorian Calendar, at the Seat of the Massasoit, in the ancestral lands of Sowams of the Pokanoket, contemporarily referred to as Bristol County, Rhode Island.

Signed and Approved By the Principal Chief of each of the undersigned Sovereign Aboriginal Tribal Nations of the lands contemporarily referred to as the Americas and Witnessed by Official Tribal Representatives.
